RN to BS in Nursing — Online Curriculum

The baccalaureate degree in nursing at Fitchburg State University is accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (www.ccneaccreditation.org).

A maximum of 88 credits composed of nursing and liberal arts and science courses taken at another accredited two- or four-year educational institution, if evaluated by the Registrar as equivalent to those offered at Fitchburg State University, is acceptable in transfer. Fitchburg State University Department of Nursing follows the Massachusetts Nursing Education Transfer Compact.

Each nursing course is delivered online in a 7-week format.

Students may take nursing courses in any order, with the following exceptions:

- 1. NURS 3500 Role Transition must be taken first.
- 2. Statistics is a pre-requisite to NURS 3710, and NURS 3710 is a pre-requisite to all 4000 level nursing courses.
- 3. The final course taken is always NURS 4600 RN to BS Capstone

Two courses, NURS 4010 and NURS 4600 have a clinical practice experience.

Liberal Arts and Science electives can be taken before the Nursing course sequence begins, concurrently with the Nursing course sequence, or upon completion of the Nursing course sequence. See reverse for liberal arts and science requirements.
