IV Budget Expenditure Analysis:

The budget for Early College and Dual Enrollment was implemented as expected and supplemented by some external funding. Early College was institutionally budgeted at \$16,722. These budgeted funds were partially spent because of the program's success in securing external funds this fiscal year. Dual Enrollment was supported by \$75,000 from MA DHE's Commonwealth Dual Enrollment funding. This was used to support 8 contract courses held during the spring and summer. The University also received \$167,040 in Early College Reimbursement Funding from MA DHE. These funds were used to support contract courses and buy-in seat scholarships for Early College students throughout the academic year and to cover the administrative expenses of the program. Additional sources of external revenue that were realized in FY 2025 through Early College and Dual Enrollment include \$34,200 in tuition paid for course work through the University Dual Enrollment program, and a \$10,000 Early College Professional Development Grant.

With the onboarding of a new Director of Early College and Dual Enrollment in October of 2024, the main goal was to learn and adopt processes that have worked so well under the previous Director. The scale and scope of the Early College and Dual Enrollment program have been sustained for the last two years, however current level of administrative capacity will soon become strained due to the growing scale and scope of the program and interest from local high schools within the region. For the fall of 2025, the program will offer 14 courses compared to 9 from the fall of 2024. This larger service footprint will require additional support or resources in the future to help maintain the growth of the program.
