b. <u>AUC #37 Course Name Change for EDUC 4550 to Practicum Seminar and course</u> <u>description update</u> (Lynn D'Agostino)

d. <u>AUC #35 New Course: IDIS 1xxx Introduction to Sustainability Studies w/Gen Ed</u> This course provides an introduction to sustainability studies that unites and gives an overview of sustainability studies. It is open to everyone.

Friendly amendment to fix typo for course description in syllabus and proposal to match.

In number 7 of proposal should read:

"This interdisciplinary course serves as an overview of the basic principles and issues of sustainability, laying out the intellectual frameworks, technological innovations, and sociopolitical developments that will bring us closer to a more sustainable and equitable global community. It provides a point of entry for students wishing to pursue various aspects of sustainability in more depth, and students will also learn about the rapidly-expanding career opportunities within the field of sustainability. 3 credits. CV, ER"

e. <u>AUC #36 New Course: ART 2xxx A Cultural History of Nature w/Gen Ed</u> (Jessica Robey)

This course looks at the cultural history of nature and the cultural construction of nature and how that has developed and changed over time.

J Hanselman: is prehistory before culture?

J. Robey: prehistoric art dates to an earlier period than previously thought.

The committee discussed the use of the term prehistory.

B. Lieberman Mentioned that there was some discussion in History Major about whether students might think the course was an HI course. B Lieberman saw the class as meeting the criteria in our LAS.

J.Robey and David Svolba: there are multiple classes that exist with the term history that do not have HI. J. Robey: Art History as the past 40 years has been framed as cultural history.

The committee discussed student interest in discussion of nature. B. Cormier mentioned cross-listing language in the proposal. Friendly amendment to strike reference to Honors course in Item 20. So read: "Spring 2026"
