First-Year Experience Seminar (RIL - 3 credits) prepares students for a successful college career by developing reading, metacognition, and information literacy skills. The course also fosters a range of planning, help-seeking, and communications skills. This course must be approved for the FYE prefix by an academic department and must address the Reading and Information Literacy learning outcomes.

First-Year Writing: $ENGL\ 1100\ Writing\ I\ (W-3\ credits)$ cultivates academic and professional writing. This course must be approved for the ENGL prefix by the English Studies Department and must address the Writing outcome.

First-Year Writing and Information Literacy Requirement: ENGL 1200 Writing II (WIL - 3 credits) fosters research-based composition by expanding on the writing emphasis of Writing I to incorporate Information Literacy. This course must be approved for the ENGL prefix by the English Studies Department and must address both the Information Literacy and Writing outcomes.

First-Year Quantitative Reasoning Requirement (QR – at least 3 credits of college level MATH and Basic Math if required) provides course options to develop quantitative reasoning. This course must be approved for the MATH prefix by the Mathematics Department and must address the Quantitative Reasoning outcome.

World Languages, Speaking and Listening (WS – at least 3 credits) provides course options that foster speaking and listening skills in English or other world languages. This course must address the World Languages, Speaking and Listening outcome.
