From the President



IT HAPPENS NEARLY EVERY DAY. A visitor who hasn't been to the university for an extended period of time remarks on how impressively different the campus looks. Generally these references are to current or completed construction projects, upgrades or beautification efforts—and there are certainly plenty of those.

However, the more important changes are less evident. To experience them, one needs to enter our classrooms and laboratories, view the transformation of teaching methods and technology, and observe the interaction between faculty and students.

The greatest strength of this institution has always been outstanding teaching. Our faculty and librarians don't just share their passion for an academic discipline, they instill in students a love of learning, provide them with personal attention, prepare them to be leaders, and emphasize social responsibility. In brief, they embody the concept of teaching and learning that underlies our mission.

Therefore, it is of the utmost importance that as senior faculty members retire we attract and retain equally high caliber new teacher-scholars who share our goals and add vitality to the academic community. As you will note from the profiles that follow, we are succeeding in this initiative. While those you will be introduced to comprise just a quarter of the faculty and librarians who joined us last year, their stories offer a sense of the excellence and passion of our entire faculty, past and present.

To revisit my initial reference to changes in our physical plant, this was an unprecedented construction season for the university. Projects spanned the entire campus, from the McKay School to the North Street corridor to Coolidge Park. Our ongoing classroom upgrade initiative continued, with particular attention paid to McKay and the Conlon Building. The latter renovation allowed for the installation of four music practice rooms on the second floor.



Weston Auditorium (at right) is now fully accessible, with a new entrance and renovated restrooms. The box office was relocated to allow for a bright and airy expanded lobby that improves energy efficiency, and a new sound-board area at the rear of the auditorium enhances the audio-visual capacity while eliminating obstructions.



With a pair of floor-to-ceiling, high resolution boards showcasing the work of the Communications Media Department, the renovated Conlon lobby is now a stunning location for viewing art, interacting or simply relaxing.

Last summer, the Department of Economics, History and Political Science moved into its new home in the completely renovated third floor of Miller Hall. The renovation included a redesign of the space to provide high-quality professional faculty offices along with student and faculty lounge spaces, new bathroom facilities and a new departmental office on the first floor.

We continue to improve safety and security on campus, with surveillance cameras added to our parking lots, electronic locks and doors on several of our buildings and emergency phones at strategic locations.

Our athletic facilities have also seen an upgrade, with the approval by the city of Fitchburg to use one of their soft-ball fields at Coolidge Park for our varsity team. The university rebuilt the field to NCAA standards, and fans can sit on newly-installed bleachers when the season starts this spring.

We renovated the Cedar Street House—a former nursing home purchased several years ago for student housing—by installing new bathrooms, kitchens and laundry facilities.

But without question, the most notable ongoing capital improvements are the Science Center and the reconstruction of the Hammond Campus Center.

The Science Center addition is on schedule to open in 2013. Its massive steel skeleton has taken rapid shape, giving the community a view of its scope and breadth. This will be a signature structure on campus, and already serves as a monument to our progress.



The campus center (opposite page, left) has been bustling with energy. As with any major renovation project, much of the existing infrastructure had to be demolished before improvements could be made in their place. The job is complicated, and its impact is felt every day, but the end result will doubtless be worth it. The renovated center, with its stunning glass entrance, will offer better access and additional space for students. It will be a proud gateway to the university.

Other highlights of the year include:

- *Completion of a draft of our self-study for the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). Thanks to the work of more than 100 individuals from our extended campus family, we have crafted a strong document that provides a detailed analysis of our strengths as well as our areas we have targeted for improvement. The NEASC visiting team will be on campus in March of 2012.*
- *A successful “Race to the Finish” for our ambitious capital campaign. With the anticipation of exceeding our original goal, we have extended the campaign through the spring of 2012. You will read more about our fundraising efforts in the back section of these pages.*
- *Continuation of work on the strategic plan, a blueprint of our goals and objectives for the coming years. A major component of both the plan and our overall academic structure is assessment. The Assessment Office works with departments to develop innovative approaches, and collects, analyzes, and reports data related to each department’s student learning and/or student service objectives. It is critical that we have in place a mechanism that will provide concrete evidence of the excellence we proclaim while offering guidance on methods to achieve ever stronger learning opportunities for our students.*
- *Exercise and sport science majors joined the expanding list of student organizations garnering national recognition. After taking top honors in the regional competition measuring knowledge in such fields as anatomy, cardiovascular physiology, and exercise endocrinology, they placed fifth in the national championship in Denver.*
- *The launching of Fitchburg Anti-Violence Education (FAVE), a program that clearly demonstrates our lack of tolerance for dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking. The initiative, supported by a \$300,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice, includes assisting every member of campus in the development of the skills necessary to effectively and safely intervene to prevent violent incidents.*

In closing, I extend my deepest thanks to all who contributed to the success of our most recent annual fund, as well as the capital campaign. In these difficult years of economic downturn and reduced state support, the realization of our ambitious goals are more and more dependent on private support. Together, we can face any challenge. Together, we can honor our tradition of making a difference each and every day.

Bugs, plants and passion

For Erin MacNeal Rehrig, the journey from her childhood outside Scranton to a faculty post at Fitchburg State has spanned institutions, states and nations.

“I’m a strong believer in non-linear paths,” she said. “I believe you’re a product of your experiences.”

Those experiences included having great science teachers that fostered a passion for biology, one that was further spurred by the Sean Connery movie “Medicine Man,” an adventure story that also delves into the chemicals plants produce in response to stress, including insects.

Rehrig earned her undergraduate degree at Bloomsburg University in Pennsylvania before going to graduate school at Pennsylvania State University, where she earned two master’s degrees, in horticulture and science education.

An affinity for teaching emerged at Penn State, where Rehrig was busy in all manners of classes as a teaching assistant. She also worked for the school as coordinator of its tutoring center as well as a computer consultant.

After years of these jobs, however, Rehrig longed to return to research.

“I enjoyed what I was doing, and I enjoyed Penn State, but I realized I wanted to go back to school for plant science,” she said.

Rehrig began her doctoral studies at Penn State and then followed her advisor—the biologist whose own mentor was the basis for Connery’s character in *Medicine Man*—to the University of Missouri, where she earned a doctorate in plant, insect and microbial science in 2010. Before coming to Fitchburg State, Rehrig spent six months living in Germany where her husband was working.

Now, Rehrig looks forward to planting roots in Massachusetts with her husband and their young daughter. She has found the atmosphere at Fitchburg State very welcoming.

“I went to a school very similar to Fitchburg State,” she said, recalling her undergraduate studies at Bloomsburg. “I had fantastic teachers. When I went to Penn State, I was

sitting next to students who went to Harvard. Schools like Fitchburg State get you access to faculty and attention you wouldn’t get at a larger school.”



Like the first-year biology course she taught in the fall, she enjoys giving her students that attention in classes and said students benefit from the spirit of collegiality among the teaching staff.

“There’s a concerted effort among the faculty to collaborate,” she said. “My colleagues are amazing here in the biology department.”

In the fall Rehrig also taught a biology methods course, designed for prospective teachers seeking licensure.

Her research interests still include the molecular mechanisms of plant-insect interaction, and Rehrig hopes to involve Fitchburg State students in collaboration with former colleagues from the University of Missouri. The research is also an area of study she looks forward to furthering once Fitchburg State’s new Science Center is up and running.

“It’s definitely a carrot hanging out there,” Rehrig said. “You know there’s going to be a great facility here.”

Fit for the Classroom

Jason Talanian came upon his profession almost by accident. The Sacramento native was completing a bachelor's degree in biology at Sacramento State and didn't know where to go next.

"I literally thumbed through the course catalog looking for something that sparked my interest," he recalls. The phrase "exercise science" struck a nerve. Already an athlete and coach, Talanian saw an opportunity to mix his personal and academic interests.

It was a good move. Today, Talanian is one of two new members of Fitchburg State's exercise and sport science faculty, and already an accomplished researcher.



He earned a master's degree in exercise science at Sacramento State and ended up in Canada for his doctoral work, studying at the University of Guelph in Ontario (near Toronto).

"I did a lot of exercise training, looking at how amino acids and caffeine affect physiology during exercise," he said.

He was part of a team conducting corporate-sponsored research on high-profile subjects including the Toronto Raptors and the Canadian Junior National Hockey Team. In all, the California student spent five years in Canada.

"I learned how to shovel snow and how to walk on ice without falling," he recalled with a smile. "When I was done with my Ph.D. I was pretty confident I wanted to be somewhere that was teaching-first."

Fitchburg State fit the bill. Exercise and sport science is a growing major at the school, and it's exploding as a career path nationwide, said Talanian, who has extended family in Massachusetts and currently calls the Boston area home.

The career paths for exercise and sport science graduates include physical therapists, personal trainers, cardiac rehab specialists and physicians assistants.

"As the careers grow, the field grows," Talanian said.

At Fitchburg State, Talanian has taught strength and conditioning, exercise testing and prescription, health and fitness and human motor development. His students include those majoring in the field as well as students rounding out their liberal arts and science requirements.

"It's a heavy science class," he said. "But it is more fun than some of the others they could take. And they do walk away with some knowledge they can take away for their whole lives."

Fitness is a problem in the U.S., Talanian said, alarmed that an estimated 60 percent of Americans are overweight, and half of those are obese.

"That's quite an amazing number," he said. "It seems like we're definitely getting the word out."

Talanian received some attention for research he helped conduct into high-intensity aerobic interval training—described as short bursts of intensive effort interspersed among more moderate workouts—which was published in the *Journal of Applied Physiology* in 2006. The study found subjects showed major improvements after just two weeks of such training in their ability to use fat for energy.

While the research showed such a training regimen would burn fat faster, it wouldn't necessarily translate into faster weight loss.

"There's no magic bullet," he said. "It's diet and exercise."

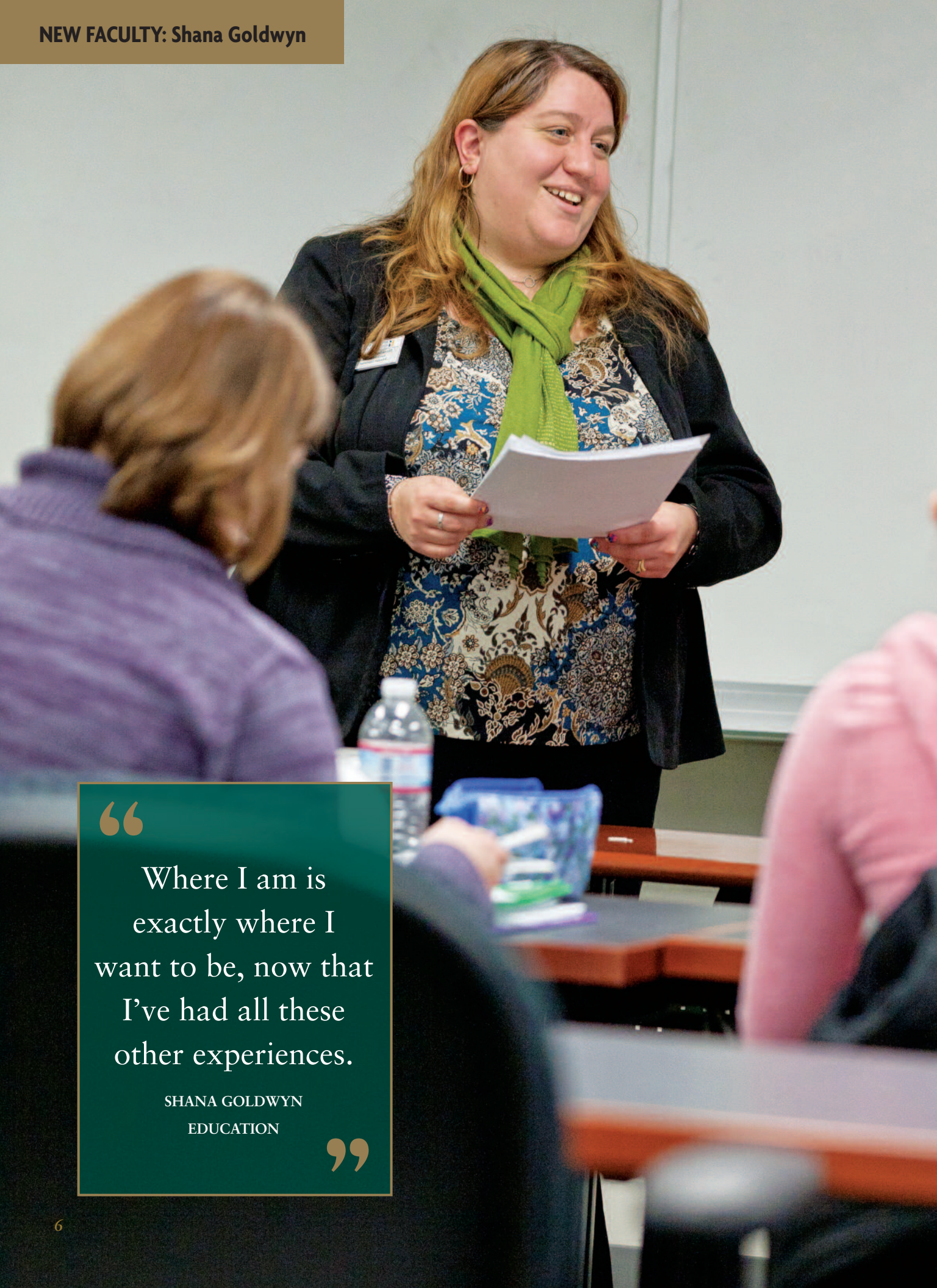

Teaching the teachers

For Shana Goldwyn, teaching has been a lifelong passion.

“I don’t remember ever not knowing I wanted to be a teacher,” said Goldwyn, who joined Fitchburg State’s education faculty in the fall.

The Connecticut native earned bachelor’s and master’s degrees from Lesley University and a doctorate from Florida State University in educational leadership and policy. She worked as a teacher before returning to academia.

Prior to coming to Fitchburg, Goldwyn was a faculty member at the University of Cincinnati, teaching in its educational leadership master’s program and urban educational leadership doctoral program. She enjoyed her time there but wanted to get back into a program focused on teacher preparation.

“I really wanted to go into the world of teacher training, and I wanted to go someplace I knew had a good reputation,” she said, and Fitchburg State fit the bill. “Where I am is exactly where I want to be, now that I’ve had all these other experiences.”

Goldwyn teaches assessment for students with and without disabilities, language development in speech and this spring will teach strategies in reading instruction. She is also chair of the graduate reading specialist program.

She believes a focus on assessment is a critical piece for good teaching.

“I’m a self-proclaimed geek in terms of understanding assessment,” said Goldwyn, whose research interests include using data for instruction and progress monitoring. “When I was teaching, I knew I wanted to know more about what happens in teacher training.”

Good teachers are willing to work hard and have the ability to reflect on their practice and determine what is and isn’t effective, said Goldwyn, who enjoys the opportunity to help guide future teachers on their way.

“The students are so committed,” she said. “They all want to be good teachers.”

In a recent class on assessment, Goldwyn guided her students through some of the steps a teacher would take in preparing an individual education plan (IEP) for a student with special needs. She encouraged the students to think about the information parents would want to know as well as the details that would be important for other parties in preparing the plan.

Fitchburg State was founded as a teacher training program, and its education program remains one of its cornerstones. Goldwyn said that legacy is well earned.

“It’s nice to be working with colleagues who are so committed to student success.”

Playing the game

Samuel F. Tobin is serious about playing games—and all in the name of research.

Tobin, who joined the Communications Media department this fall, looks at games from a critical perspective.

“I tend to work a lot on boredom and killing time as an idea,” he said. “Game study is a very hip area, in some ways.”

Tobin said much of the scholarly work around gaming tends to focus on subjects who are passionate about a game; those folks who spend 40 hours at a pop in an immersive online role-playing environment, for example.

But Tobin is more intrigued by what he sees as an under-represented element of game study—those which we play just to pass the hours.

“If someone is playing handball in prison, they know it’s not going to liberate them,” he explained. “But they’d be very upset if you took the ball away.”

Tobin’s road to Fitchburg State was long and full of detours. The son of academics, his was a somewhat nomadic youth. Born in Japan, he grew up in Hawaii, and had called Chicago and New Hampshire home before he went to college. He earned his undergraduate degree at Hampshire College in Massachusetts and did his postgraduate

studies at the New School University (where he earned a master’s in new media studies) and the New School for Social Research (earning a Ph.D. in sociology).

In between his degrees he taught briefly in Westminster, and that was his introduction to North Central Massachusetts.

He was an adjunct faculty member at the New School and New York University for the past several years, but Fitchburg State marks his first full-time teaching post.

Tobin is enjoying the change of pace of living with his wife in North Central Massachusetts after a decade in Brooklyn.

“I haven’t had a car since 2000,” he said. “I wanted extreme change.”

In his first semester, Tobin taught human communication and introduction to media and communication, as well as game design.

“It is a pleasure to work with such engaged and conscientious students,” Tobin said. “I find they rise to the challenge of high expectations.”

In the gaming class, Tobin had his students develop their own board games and led discussions of how to analyze existing games. He brandished a checkerboard during one recent class.

“How can we think of games as narrative,” he challenged his students. One replied that the game could be seen as a story of peons rising up against a king, and a tale of betrayal and sacrifice.

Tobin nodded his agreement. “I can see the movie poster now.”



Nursing the next generation

It was a broken arm at the age of 7 that set Nancy Duphily on the road to a career in nursing.

“I was always in the hospital because I was a tomboy,” Duphily recalled. On this occasion, as the doctor was resetting the bone in her arm, she remembers the comfort of the nurse’s palm on her forehead. “I always wanted to be a nurse. Always.”

She smiles as she describes how the ambitions of her youth became a rewarding and ever-evolving career.

“I feel I’m so lucky to get up every morning and do what I love to do,” said Duphily, now a grandmother of two (with another on the way in March).



Years of work in several disciplines of nursing kept Duphily near the classroom. She earned a bachelor of science in nursing and a master’s degree from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst, and in 2010 earned a doctorate from Regis College.

In between those scholastic achievements she was working as a nurse, raising a family, and teaching nursing at Mount Wachusett Community College in Gardner and Framingham State College, as well as in North Carolina. Her recent doctorate prepared her for teaching at the university level.

“No matter how many years you’ve been a teacher or a nurse, you’re always learning,” she said.

In her doctoral work, Duphily looked at how nurse-educators are mentored.

“It doesn’t necessarily figure that a great nurse makes a great teacher,” she said. “What I love about Fitchburg State is they facilitate the growth of a nurse-educator. There’s always somebody that has your back. I’ve not always seen that. What I love here is, they bring the research and the practice together, and it’s all about teaching.”

In her first semester at Fitchburg State, Duphily taught maternity nursing. That course work included two days a week in the classroom and two days in a clinical setting; in this case, the University of Massachusetts Memorial Medical Center in Worcester.

With up to 20 babies being delivered every day at the Worcester hospital, the visiting nursing students are exposed to a variety of cases and diverse groups of families. The experience provides valuable insight and learning opportunities for young nurses, Duphily said, and complements the instruction they receive in the simulation labs on campus.

On a recent morning in the simulation lab, Duphily was running several students through the paces of a patient evaluation. The student nurses were given brief summaries of the patient’s condition and had to deliver treatment—in one case, a dose of valium for a patient who had lost an arm in a car crash.


Duphily observed to make certain the student nurse followed the right steps in addressing the patient, preparing to administer the medication and noting the steps and observations to follow in a real-life situation. Some of the students were nervous, and Duphily reassured them with a smile when they had covered all the bases.

The simulation labs at Fitchburg State are fully loaded, she said, and provide a solid training ground for the nursing students. And it’s good preparation for what they will face during their clinical placements.

The nature of the clinical settings in which Fitchburg State students are placed is a testament to the strength of the program and the relationships its faculty have forged over the years, Duphily said. The university’s nursing graduates are at top hospitals, she said, and in leadership roles.

And what she has seen of the next generation of nurses gives her hope for the future. Her students are eager to learn and practice in the lab even in their spare time.

“They’re very prepared, they do their homework,” she said. “I’d like them to take care of me in my old age.”

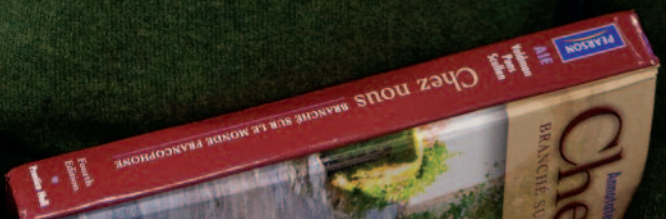

Speaking in tongues

“The smartest way to find out about another people is to start with the language,” says Yasser Derwiche Djazaerly. “It is a window into the culture.”

And it is a window Djazaerly is seeking to open to his students in the humanities department, where he teaches French and Arabic.

Djazaerly was born and raised in Syria and, from an early age, his mother—a former schoolteacher—fostered a commitment to education.

It was his interest in economics that brought him to the U.S., where he studied at the University of Wisconsin in Madison. In order to further prepare himself for a career in international banking and finance, he started learning French and German.

“I learned languages to be a better economist, but I found culture and languages far more exciting,” he said.

He earned a Ph.D. in German from Stanford University and has finished all but his dissertation to qualify for a second Ph.D. from Stanford, this one in French literature.

“I loved both cultures, and did not want to choose between the two,” he said.

Djazaerly also speaks Italian.

At Fitchburg State, Djazaerly hopes to replicate the programmatic expansion he experienced at his previous teaching post, Sam Houston State University in Texas. He taught Fitchburg’s first-ever Arabic course in the fall and looks forward to collaborating with other departments to restore the French minor and create a minor in Middle Eastern studies. He also wants to bring back German to Fitchburg State and is planning on offering first-semester German in the fall.

The opportunity to strengthen programs was part of the appeal of Fitchburg State, Djazaerly said, as was the university’s proximity to Boston.

“It’s my wife’s and my favorite U.S. city,” he said.

The students who took Arabic in the fall were a diverse group, Djazaerly said, including several criminal-justice majors as well as some who were just “culturally curious.” This curiosity would serve students well, he said, as the Arab world will continue to play a major role in global affairs, raising the demand for cultural and linguistic literacy.



“There are as many Arabs as there are Americans,” Djazaerly said. “It’s as culturally diverse as the U.S.”

He also hopes to see language opportunities expand at the university, with German and further Arabic classes. The students who took introductory Arabic in the fall have a basis in the language, and he wants to help them continue their pursuits, even if it’s on an independent-study level.

“It’s something I’m committed to,” he said.

Private industry and research fuel passion for teaching

In his position as an industrial researcher for the printing industry, John LaFleche found himself doing a lot of teaching—an experience that would alter the course of his career.

LaFleche, who hails from outside of Albany, N.Y., worked as a consultant for companies like Eastman Kodak, Hewlett-Packard and Gerber Scientific. An engineer by training, LaFleche managed research teams, and in that role he was teaching employees about paper handling and thermal dynamics, and product robustness and optimization.

“What I’m passionate about, and have been throughout my career, has been teaching,” he said. “It’s making highly complex technical problems understandable. That’s been my brand.”



The career transition also allows LaFleche to spend more time with his family; his consulting work put him frequently on the road, and a university schedule is more predictable. At the same time, he will have the opportunity to continue his research during the academic hiatus each summer.

LaFleche earned a bachelor’s degree in mechanical engineering, a master’s degree in materials science and a doctorate in applied mechanics, all from the University of Rochester. It did not take long working in industry to realize how much he still had to learn.

“That was all very theoretical,” he said, recalling his classroom instruction. “When you work in industry, you never stop learning.”

It’s a sentiment he brings with him to the classrooms at Fitchburg State. Within the introductory technical drawing classes he teaches, for example, he encourages students to think about the production and marketing pipelines into which those drawings fit.

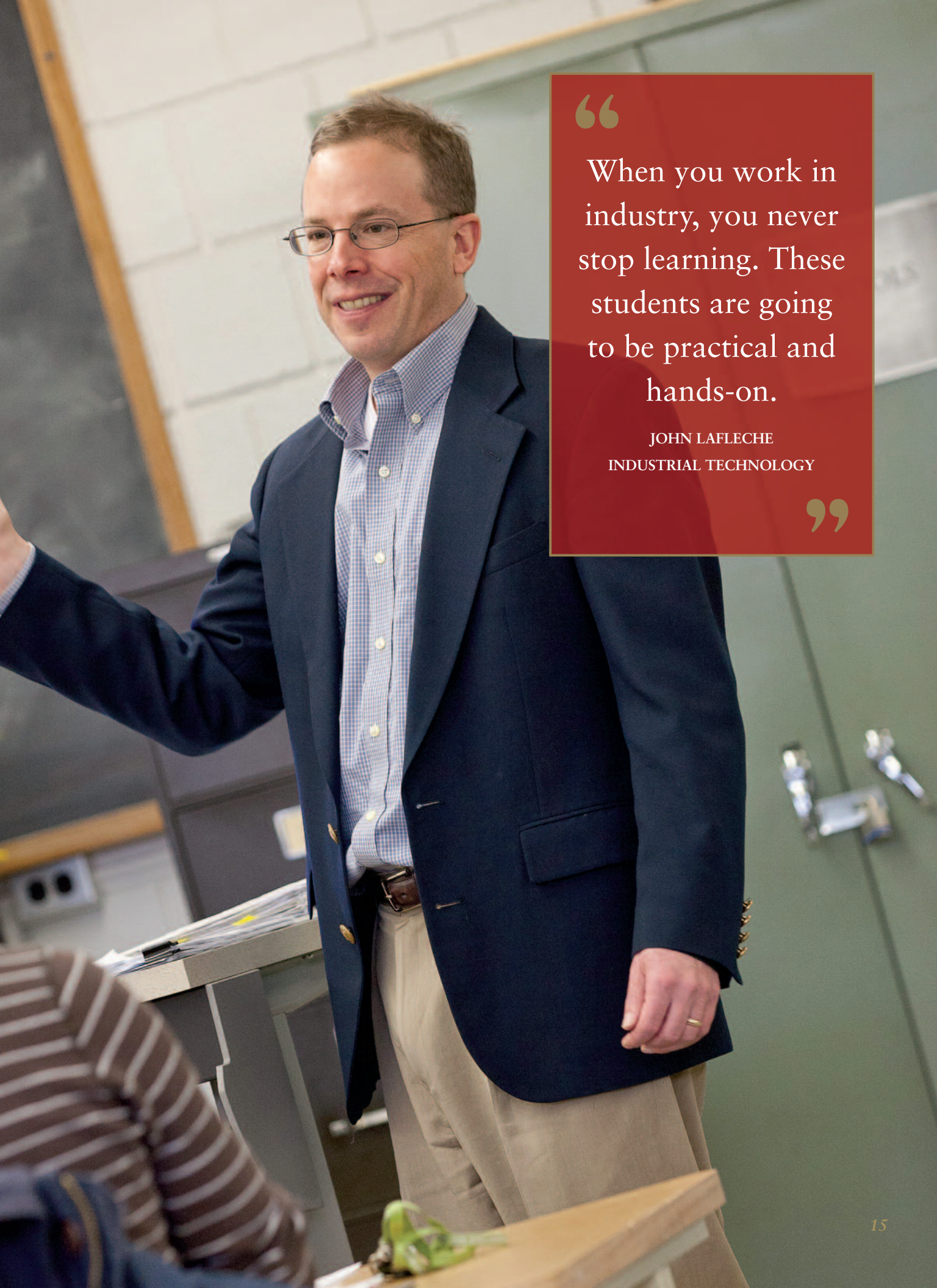
“In today’s world, you’re not in a silo,” he said.

LaFleche’s classes also include production planning and control and strength of materials. Those courses describe how processes in manufacturing work together, from early design to the supply chain and quality control.

His years in industry have made him a better teacher, he said, as he endeavors to make the lessons seem real to his students.

“If my background was all research, what I could contribute would be very limited,” he said. “These students are going to be practical and hands-on.”





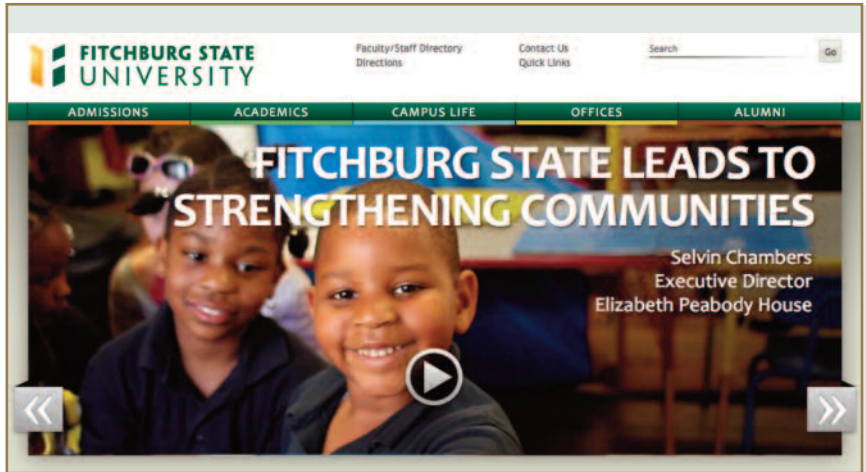

University gains new stewards

Anthony J. Mercadante, CPA, a lifelong Fitchburg resident, became managing partner of Mercadante & Mercadante PC in 1986 at the age of 27, a family business that has continued to increase its customer base under his leadership. The success of the company, which focuses primarily on auditing, led to Mercadante being asked to join

industry leaders on a variety of local and statewide boards.

Heidi Krupa was in her third year studying nursing at Fitchburg State University when her country called.

The Springfield native, who had signed up with the Army Reserve as a

Staff Sgt. Krupa returned to the U.S. in September. Rather than take some time to readjust to civilian life, she instead returned to Fitchburg State within days of her arrival.

"It's been a lifesaver for me," she said, describing the importance of resuming her previous routine as quickly as possible.

The university, she said, bent over backwards to accommodate her—keeping her place in school, registering her for classes and tending to other duties that could have disrupted her studies.

For all the support the school gave her while she was deployed, Staff Sgt. Krupa nominated Fitchburg State for the military's Employer Support of the

Antonucci also signed a statement of support for the Guard and Reserve, indicating the university's recognition of their importance to the well-being of our communities.

FAVE raises the shades

The Fitchburg Anti-Violence Education (FAVE) program was launched last spring in an effort to reduce relationship violence. The program, funded with support from the U.S. Department of Justice Office on Violence Against Women, seeks to create a community of active bystanders on the Fitchburg State campus.

Starting last fall, all incoming undergraduate students must attend training programs designed to educate them about dating violence, sexual assault and stalking, while learning strategies to intervene safely on behalf of their peers to prevent incidents from occurring. The training also includes a performance of the play "Drawing the Shades," performed by Fitchburg State students. The play features four young people discussing how their lives have been shattered by sexual assault and violence.

More than 1,000 Fitchburg State students have been trained as active bystanders. Dozens of faculty and staff from across campus also volunteered to be trained as trainers for the ongoing effort.

Film series connects campus and city

A new film series being offered at the Fitchburg Public Library promises to build bridges between the campus and downtown. The brainchild of professors Eric Budd (Economics, History and Political Science) and Joseph Moser (English), the monthly

series of free film screenings will be introduced by faculty members for a public audience.

The films are screened at 7 p.m. on the third Thursday of every month of the academic year in the library's auditorium.

The series began with Moser's holiday-themed pick, "Remember the Night" from 1940, featuring Barbara Stanwyck and Fred MacMurray (before their legendary collaboration "Double Indemnity") in a light-hearted Christmas story written by the great Preston Sturges. In January, Sean Goodlett (History) presents the World War I drama "Passchendaele" (2008).

Upcoming titles in the series include "Twelve Angry Men" (1957) introduced by Angela Nastasee-Carder (English) on February 16; "How to Beat the High Cost of Living" (1980) introduced by Kate Jewell (History) on March 22; "The Grapes of Wrath" (1940) introduced by George Bohrer (Communications Media) on April 19; and "Paradise Now" (2005) introduced by Budd, on May 17.

The series is set to continue in 2012-13.

A winning case

The university will send two teams to the American Collegiate Moot Court Association national tournament after a strong showing at the regional competition. Students Matthew Costello, Sydney Kirsch, Angela Szymcik and Edwin Pacheco Diaz were selected to represent Fitchburg State at Chapman University Law School in California.

The university hosted the association's eastern regional undergraduate qualifying tournament. The event brought more than 40 teams from 17 colleges and universities up and down the eastern seaboard to Fitchburg, including first-time participants Duke University and McGill University.

The moot court program puts students in the position of attorneys arguing the merit of a fictional Supreme Court case. This year, the students argued both sides of a case in which a man was arrested for threatening to assassinate the president. He was charged for aiding and abetting threats made by others on an Internet chat room he controlled.

During the tournament, students presented their cases to the court,

embodied by members of the local legal community and other dignitaries. The tournament was sponsored by Fitchburg State and the North Worcester County Bar Association.



A campus united

Highland Avenue once divided the main section of the campus from Mara Village, the residence hall complex that hundreds of students call home while at Fitchburg State. But that changed when a section of the street was closed to traffic and converted into a tree-lined pedestrian plaza, with seating and a gazebo.

Within hours of its completion, the plaza became a gathering spot for students. The elimination of vehicular traffic has created a more unified campus, with students no longer need-

ing to keep an eye out for speeding traffic as they travel between the residence halls and their classes. The remaining stretch of Highland Avenue between the plaza and Pearl Street now has two-way traffic and has resulted in a net gain of parking spaces.

The Sound and Vision of Success



You will never see **Jack Sherman '88** in any of the films, television shows and documentaries on his extensive list of credits, but you will hear the vivid sound effects and dialogues that he has edited and delight in the imagery that he makes perfect.

Nominated for a 2011 Golden Reel for Best Sound Editing by his colleagues of the Motion Picture Sound Editors for his work on the four-

hour PBS documentary *For Love of Liberty: The Story of America's Black Patriots*, Sherman said it was quite the honor just to be there.

"Seeing the legendary editor Walter Murch (who was introduced by George Lucas) being awarded a lifetime achievement award was awesome in itself," said Sherman, describing the Academy Award-winning editor and sound designer whose credits include *Apocalypse Now* and *The English Patient*.

For Love of Liberty, which won a 2011 NAACP Image Award in the Outstanding Documentary category, depicts the millions of African-American soldiers who took part in the Revolutionary War to modern day conflicts around the globe. Its cast includes such luminaries as Colin Powell, Morgan Freeman, Ossie Davis, Ruby Dee, Robert Duvall, Bill Cosby and others reading letters, diaries, speeches and military records.

Sherman's job was to research and find historically accurate sounds for the film, including swords and muskets from the Revolutionary War to engine sounds of today's armored tanks, and quill pens scratching on parchment paper to the clackity-clack of manual typewriters and early computer keyboards, and edit them into the film.

"I emphasize to my students at the Art Institute that the job is 50 percent technical, 50 percent artistic," Sherman said. "You need to know a lot about both for a TV show to get on the air, it's a science, whereas film is more of an art form," he noted.

"I had a great experience at Fitchburg State, was involved with radio station WXPL and was a DJ with a radio show every semester. The internship I had at a cable station in Cambridge, Mass., got my foot in the door," said Sherman.

After a 15-year tenure in Boston, which included being the only C-SPAN camera operator allowed in the room with Yasser Arafat on his first visit to an American university, Sherman and his wife moved to the West Coast in 2003 where he paid his dues as a freelancer. He worked his way up the editing ladder, having fun along the way, too...making beautiful women on Playboy TV look even more beautiful and meeting famed Playboy magazine photographer Amy Freytag.

Sherman is moving on in the editing world, he has since edited two a feature-length films, a romantic comedy "Broom Wedding" and a Western "Gang of Roses 2," and has a PBS Special in the works with producer Ron Howard. He is currently the Supervising Editor at Telco Productions in Santa Monica, Calif.

The Road to Leadership



In fewer than eight years, **Jennifer L. Flanagan '04** has gone from Fitchburg State graduate student to leadership positions in the Massachusetts Legislature, playing important roles in major issues affecting the state.

As state senator, Flanagan serves as assistant vice chair of the Committee on Ways and Means, chairs the Committee on Steering and Policy, vice-chairs the Joint Committee for Transportation and

Public Service, and is a member of the Joint Committee on Telecommunications, Utilities and Energy.

Most recently, Flanagan was selected to help merge the House and Senate versions of Gov. Deval Patrick's bill to bring casino gambling to Massachusetts.

"Technically, this has taken years, but it took just a few weeks to merge the two pieces of legislation," Flanagan said of the gambling issue. "Our job was to put the two bills side by side, look at every comma, every semi-colon, all the differences, 300 pages of highlighted items, while being under the scrutiny of the press and the public."

The governor subsequently signed the bill into law.

Flanagan was in graduate school at Fitchburg State when she launched her political career running for state representative in the 4th Worcester District.

"I was a non-traditional night student, but I met what were to be my best friends through that program," she recalled. "Fitchburg State was the only school I applied to for my master's degree. The work provided me with more confidence in and knowledge of myself. The program was not an easy one; it was rigorous and demanding. It was also closer to home, as I was traveling back and forth to Boston at the time." She earned her degree in 2004.

After two terms in the state House of Representatives, Flanagan was elected to the state Senate in 2008. Her sprawling district includes Ashby, Bolton, precincts in Clinton, Fitchburg, Gardner, Lancaster, Leominster, Lunenburg, Sterling, Townsend and Westminster.

Flanagan was disappointed that Leominster, Fitchburg and Gardner were split apart in the recent Congressional redistricting, but wasted no time advocating for her constituents in the new map.

"I spoke to Congressmen (James) McGovern and (Niki) Tsongas, as those three cities are the hubs of North Central Massachusetts," she said. "On a positive note, we will now have two congressmen who will serve our constituents.

"We are a very close-knit delegation here in North Central Massachusetts," Flanagan said, describing the rapport among fellow legislators from the region. "Everyone gets on board together, whatever the issues are. People will not see a gap in services or representation."

Flanagan also keeps in close contact with the friends she made in her graduate studies at Fitchburg State.

"I still have the picture of us at graduation," she said. "There were more tears shed at that graduation than at my undergraduate ceremony. It's been an interesting journey."

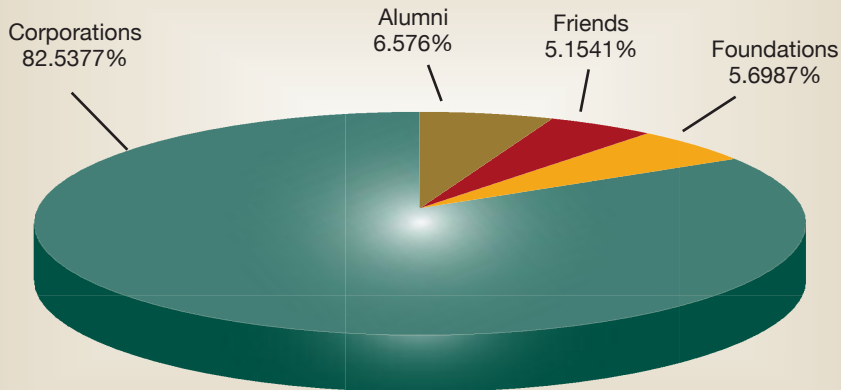

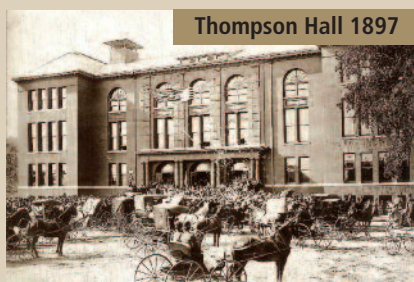
