- I changed majors from Communications (Graphic Design) to Interdisciplinary Studies. My experience in the graphic design program was very poor. Professor Simmons was personable but ineffective both as an instructor and as an academic advisor.

Professor Goldstein was rude, apathetic to student needs, unwilling to provide more than minimal out-ofclass communication with students, mismanaged student time in his classes and openly disrespectful of students' efforts and concerns. In order to justify his continued employment as a professor, he would have to provide instruction of such incredible quality that graduating under him would guarantee any student immediate and long-lasting employment in the field of graphic design. Instead, he is only barely competent.

Professor David Svolba is the greatest teacher I have ever had in any subject, level, or year of education. He is clever, manages his class time well, engages his students, respects his students, actively works to make sure his students understand the course material, and provides a level of instruction that should be admired by his peers.

My negative experience with the my experience at Fitchburg State comes from within the nursing department. I feel that RN to BSN students are not given the help and support they need in securing a clinical site and preceptor for the two courses that require clinical. It has been very discouraging and

stressful. Industrial technology needs to take a look at the concentrations they are offering and be able to provide the courses described on the concentration description sheet. The "energy management technology"

¹ contraction was very poorly constructed, with courses that were never offered for numerous reasons, not enough students, facility/lab/equipment issues and poor department organization.
I found Fitchburg State to be a wonderful school. There were in my opinion very few teachers who i thought were outstanding and concerned with the progression of students in the class. Some teachers had a passion for the subject they were teaching while other classes just passed out packets and said, Complete this and thats it. The classes i learned the most were the ones that involved myself and the class. The classes were formatted as a discussion not a lecture. Also, my advisor wasn't very helpful. They didn't

- 12. exactly sit down with me my freshman year and tell me everything i needed to know. I know some of its my responsibility but other stuff they should be telling you about. For example, Degree Evaluation, visiting career services to help find a job after or during school, or even suggesting websites to help find a job in the field you are studying. There was no push or help in that. It was just get the classes and thats it. Advisors are suppose to help you find the classes you need and also in my opinion help with finding a job if they are still interested in having a career in their field of study. That to me is what student teacher relations should be all about. Overall though, i did enjoy a lot of my classes. I learned a lot and this is just the beginning. I have had an excellent experience working with your talented staff who helped me become a better
- 13. secondary school teacher in my trade of automotive technology at a local technical high school, my mind has really been opened to a lot of different perspectives in life and doing this helps my students as well, always paying it forward.







- 17. I thought the English department was excellent, and the classes were of an excellent size. Job well done to them.






