## **Development Day focuses on assessment**

Faculty returned to campus last week for Development Day programming that focused on assessment.

The keynote address was by Dr. Natasha Jankowski, director of the National Institute for Learning Outcomes Assessment. Her talk, entitled "Examining Prismatic Learning: Exploring Intersections of Assessment, Equity, and

Culturally Responsive Practices," sought to reframe assessment as a means of supporting students and faculty, instead of a compliance reporting exercise.

Development Day also included breakout sessions led by faculty and administrators on topics like assessments related to accreditation; developing written program assessment plans; mapping course learning outcomes to assessment; and assessing the new liberal arts and sciences curriculum.

## Winter Commencement ceremony breaks records

More than 600 undergraduate and graduate degrees were conferred at our 123rd commencement exercises, winter ceremony, on Friday, Dec. 20. It was the largest winter ceremony (by attendance) in university history.

Attending graduates, including those who had completed their studies online and never before set foot on the university's physical



campus, hailed from Massachusetts as well as Arizona, California, Connecticut, Florida, Kansas, Michigan, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Vermont, Wisconsin and the Northern Mariana Islands. The university has seen huge growth in its online accelerated degree programs.

Glenn Roberts died in 2013 at age 49 after a brave fight against ALS, also known as Lou Gehrig's Disease. Roberts, who worked at Mount Wachusett Community College for more than 20 years, completed a master's degree in counseling psychology at Fitchburg State in 1992. His wife, Debra Roberts, a triple Falcon, compled degrees here in 1990, 1994 and 2003.
