VIII Other Accomplishments:

The library highlights accomplishments in the following 4 areas:

- 1. The library collaboratively developed a library-wide <u>assessment plan</u> with goals and pragmatic steps for completion, including a timeline. While all areas of the library created assessment goals, I highlight here the creation of a sustainable assessment approach of the information literacy program. In addition, the assessment skills of the librarians are being utilized across campus as one librarian is serving as the General Education Ambassador for the General Education Program assessment of *Information Literacy, Reading and Writing* and another librarian is on its Learning Outcomes Assessment group.
- 2. The library leads the university on open education initiatives. It is recognized across the state as a leader in open educational resources, as demonstrated by its leadership in creating an OER Assessment plan that will be adopted by all public higher education institutions in Massachusetts. In addition, Fitchburg State librarians present and share their OER expertise across the state and at national conferences. The library also helped secure a 1.3 million dollar grant from the federal Department of Education that will flow to 6 public higher education institutions in Massachusetts. This grant, the ROTEL Grant, promotes textbook affordability, student success, and inclusion and equity to benefit all students, particularly minoritized students at the six institutions. The ROTEL grant provides stipends for faculty to remix and/or develop accessible, intentionally inclusive open textbooks and other OER that reflect students' local and lived experiences.
- 3. The library continued its commitment to educating the Fitchburg State community and itself on the realities and impacts of systemic racism. The staff have begun implementing its own Diversity, Equity and inclusion plan with actionable goals and strategies. The library staff completed another children's collections analysis project, in collaboration with the School of Education, in order to elevate underrepresented voices in that collection. A new oral history project, *Building Representation of Underrepresented Alumni Voices in the Oral History Collection,* funded by the Fitchburg State University Dean's Anti-Racism Fund is underway and almost complete. The project documents the experiences of Fitchburg State alumni of color, in order to better integrate their experiences into the history of our University as documented in the archives. Other library projects include researching minoritized students' use and perceptions of the library (in partnership with an Education faculty member), and a presentation to faculty researchers on how to incorporate equity and accessibility practices in their work. The anti-racism work of the library was recognized by the Association of College and Research Libraries when it featured the library's work in the VAL Spotlight Series: Practices of Equity & Social Justice Fitchburg State University Library (Sept 2022).
- 4. The library strives to be a central and interdisciplinary hub for our students, faculty and the local community. Exciting new programs this year included in-person events of **the** <u>Michael V.</u> <u>Addorisio Family collection launch</u>, <u>Faculty Research Summer Camp</u>, <u>Between the Stacks student play performances</u>, <u>FSU Board Game Night in the Library</u> and Community Read: Film Screening of

Nomadland. Recent community partnerships include librarians working with the Fitchburg High School Honors Program, FSU Corporate and Community Engagement Working Group, Crocker Center Advisory Board, Fitchburg Public Library Board of Trustees, and the North of Main project.

Major initiatives for FY23 are reflected in the <u>Library's FY23 Action Plan</u>. We call special attention to:

- All areas of the library will implement the new assessment plan and collect evidence, document success, share results, and make improvements.
- The Library will engage in a self- study assessment project with a report drafted in summer 2022 and site visits by evaluator in fall 2022.
- A new strategic plan will be drafted in Spring 2023 and completed in Summer 2023.

I am so proud of how they continue to respond in innovative ways to the pandemic and to other challenges such as the two unexpected building closings this year.
