The mission of Fitchburg State Early College and Dual Enrollment is to provide college credit-bearing opportunities to high school students with the goals of fostering partnerships among educational institutions in the local community, increasing regional students' exposure to and engagement with Fitchburg State, and increasing college access and success among underserved and diverse students.

IV Budget Expenditure Analysis:

Was the budget expended as planned? Were additions/changes made, and if so, explain.

The budget for Early College was implemented as expected. Strategic Funding in the amount of \$19,222 was ear marked to support offering two Early College contract courses with books and material during the fall semester as well as other courses and enrollments throughout the academic year. In addition to University funds, Dual Enrollment was also supported by \$40,000 from MA DHE's Commonwealth Dual Enrollment funding. This was used to support contract courses held during the spring and summer, to provide course scholarship support for 27 University Dual Enrollments during the spring semester. The University also received \$69,345 in Early College Reimbursement Funding based on the number of credits in which Early College students were enrolled in throughout the year. This is a 18.9% increase in external Early College funding from 2020-2021. These funds were used to support contract courses and buy-in seat scholarships for Early College students throughout the academic year, and to provide approximately \$15,000 of salary support for program administration.

University Dual Enrollment served 25 students for 184 total credits in Fall 2021 and 24 students for 177 credits in Spring 2022.
