The state Department of Higher


Education has awarded Fitchburg State University a grant worth nearly \$75,000 to fund institutional efforts to better support students, including training for faculty and staff.

The grant came from the state's <u>Higher Education Innovation</u> Fund.

The project builds on the university's implementation of Dr. Paul

Hernandez's "Pedagogy of Real Talk" (PRT), which focuses on engaging, teaching and connecting with students at risk. The approach relies on an understanding of the student as a human being, and seeks to create an inclusive, relationship-rich, and student-centered learning environment.

Innovation Fund proposals sought for 2023-24

Last week, President Lapidus announced the opening of our 2023-24 Innovation Fund requests for proposals.

Proposals will be reviewed for two separate funds, each totaling \$250,000, to support new or continuing projects.

- The <u>Academic Innovation Fund</u> supports faculty and librarians in developing or expanding innovative curricula and/or pedagogy that stimulates enrollment growth and supports student academic success within a framework of equity and inclusion. All full-time faculty and librarians are eligible to apply, as are full- or part-time faculty teaching in the School of Graduate, Online and Continuing Education.
- The University Innovation Fund supports our staff in developing or expanding

innovative practices, programs, or services that stimulate enrollment growth, support student retention, and/or promote financial sustainability within a framework of equity and inclusion.

Proposals, which are due **Friday**, **Feb. 10**, should be submitted through the dynamic forms that will be shared with the campus community in the coming weeks.

Coming soon: New library search tool

The <u>Amelia V. Gallucci-Cirio</u> <u>Library</u> is launching a new

integrated library system (ILS), which includes its new cloud-based FalconSearch discovery interface, in January.

The new ILS will replace its older Voyager, Summon and Journal Finder systems. FalconSearch will provide a more seamless user experience through a single access point to many of the Library's print and electronic resources including journal articles, books, newspapers, videos, images, archival material, tech lending library, and more.

Sustainability Snapshot

The Sustainability Advisory
Committee shares the following
information for the campus
community: It is estimated that
heating and hot water can make up 42
percent of total carbon dioxide
emissions in an urban environment in
the northeastern United States.

However, according to the

Department of Energy, a typical home could reduce their carbon dioxide emissions from heating by six percent (the equivalent of planting ten trees) simply by lowering their thermostat by two degrees during the winter. The lion's share of emissions from campus comes from energy used to heat buildings and Fitchburg State has already utilized renewable sources for building heat. A geothermal heat pump makes use of the stable temperatures underground to cool in the summer and heat in



winter and is in use at one of the buildings on campus.

Faculty Notes

Professor Viera Lorencova (Communications Media) was <u>published</u> in the book *Queer Print in Europe* by Bloomsbury Publishing, London, UK. Professor Lorencova's chapter, entitled "Sexual Difference and Queer Subjectivity in Slovak LGBTQ Print Periodicals," maps the trajectories of six print periodicals produced in Slovakia over the last three decades and explores how they reflected and shaped the agendas of LGBTI rights advocates.

Professor Kelly Morgan (Communications Media) directed the play *Flight Delay* by Peter Anderegg, now being performed at <u>The Tank</u> in New York City. The play runs through Dec. 18. The play is set at a snowed-in airport, where a father meets one of his estranged middle-aged twin sons - but doesn't know which - and his son is not about to tell him, not while there's a chance to settle old scores. With nowhere to go and little to do, the son alternates identities as he pursues his father from one waiting area to the next. *Flight Delay* shows how painful letting go of ancient resentments to finally take flight can be.
