




1. Please select the semester will you complete your program requirements from the list below:

3. Please select the major field your studied for your degree:





- I wish that their are more DESE approved graduate level math courses to help us "math" teachers satisfy
 DESE requirements.
- As an education major, it is disheartening to have gone through a Bachelor's and Master's program at a

 NON-updated McKay building. When we go upstairs, we see how the other departments have been updated; however, the education level is still stuck in decades that have long been in the past. I would love to see some updated classrooms for the education department.
- 3. great online program with fast graduation
- 4. I was very content with Fitchburg State and would highly recommend the University
 - CLB program was confusing and hard to manage at points. Reaching the CLB office was difficult and over the phone, CLB was rude and unprofessional. Questions regarding tuition was met with frustration and
- yelling on CLB's part. Fitchburg was always helpful in helping sort out my confusion but not having a new student packet made logging onto web4, student email, and other portions of the FSU site difficult and frustrating.
- My advisor only interacted with me once when I first applied at FSU. I needed her help planning and mapping out my courses. The tentative plan she gave me covered all my courses, only it did not take into account pre-requisites! I was the one who caught the fact that some courses are pre-requisites for others and so had to switch around the courses in order to make sure I graduate within 2 years, as I wanted. Had I followed her plan as is, I would have had to graduate one semester late because of one course that was planned to be taken during my last semester, when in fact it is a pre-requisite for one of my other courses.
- school itself. I came back as a graduate student and was disappointed to find out that all of the special education master's programs were online. Personally, I do not get as much out of the class with the on-line format and would have had a more meaningful experience if I was able to meet with my professor's in person.

- 8. I felt that the online MBA program was challenging, invigorating and a great value. I can think of no other institution that can give a high quality graduate education for \$12,000. It has been a great experience.

I am very appreciative of the vision and efforts by Dr. Daneen Deptula to add structure and rigor as well as incorporate evidence-based studies into the curriculum of the Clinical Mental Health Counseling program.  - I am in the MBA graduate online program. Professors have too many students sometimes 100-180 at a time. With that many students, there is very little activity/feedback from the professor. I received the same one-sentence feedback for each assignment for two classes by the same professor. Professors didn't always read your posts or papers using software to grade them. Some of the material was out of date. For example, no material used more current than 2012. I had to use chapter learning to come up with ways
- Apple could do better since the iPod was introduced. My best classes were with professors that had 45 or less students.

 It would be helpful if the courses in the Online Graduate rotation were offered each seven week term for
- 11. those who don't wish to take a three month break between October 30th, 2018 and January 21, 2019. My academic advisor Bev Hollingsworth was not very helpful the one time I emailed her regarding the differences between 2 accounting courses. She only answered which class would fulfill the graduation

- 34. Updating and re-evaluating of classes may need to happen in order to provide quality information to help advance teacher instruction and preparation.
- 35. Accounting not listed as a Major or Minor for choices re MBA.
- 36. Very little was done in the classroom to adress changes in the education system happening due to current politics. This was no address by any Professor.
- Loved the accelerated program. It fit into my schedule and allowed me to complete my degree quickly. I

 37. think more graduate programs should consider using the accelerated model. I would have loved that when I

 was getting my first masters degree.
- 38. Housing services could be improved. And how well the bookstore is managed could be improved
 - Availability of online professors wasn't/isn't always as supportive as it should be. Some online professors weren't very actively involved in the instruction of course content and didn't prepare many of their own resources for the course. Many online professors didn't incorporate many technology aspects. The use of ZOOM was not as beneficial as an in-class session would have been. The use of group and cooperative learning was not incorporated into many courses. Although group learning is challenging to incorporate into online courses, it should have been more of a priority.
 - I have had a wonderful experience over the last few years in the MSN graduate program. Finding clinical experiences to complete the required hours would have been much easier if we had more information and support from the nursing faculty. I practically had to beg for a list of previous placements when I began my clinical. By narrowing down a list of willing clinical sites, students will have a better clinical experience. I understand that this is a unique major, but if it has been part of the Fitchburg State University academic program, the college of nursing must provide more support in finding appropriate placements in Massachusetts.
- 40. For the final course, nursing research, I consistently reached out by phone and email to the professor/advisor for feedback on my paper. Most of the time I did not receive a reply, and had to make multiple attempts to reach her before she would give feedback on the progress of the paper. I felt that her feedback was snarky at times, and points were taken off of grading for things that she made corrections on, as I made the changes she requested. Reaching out for help seemed futile at times. I believe that although I have finished my research paper and am graduating, I would have benefitted from having an advisor who was not the professor for the course. It seems that her mind is focused elsewhere and not on advising students in their last semester, which should be a major focus. I have heard similar comments and concerns from other graduate students. I trust that this feedback is anonymous and that I will not be penalized for my comments. I look forward to graduation on December 21, 2018.
- Overall I have had a great experince and professors have been beyond amazing. The academic advisors are never available and it seem no one ever has a valid reason why they can not be found. For online students it is very important to return calls in a manner shorter than 2 weeks. Also the curriculum for the MBA online program w/ concentration in hr should be amended to state that alter active courses can be taken for the elective recon course. It state that it is required and my advisor did was not available to advise.
- 42. My advisor was continuously unavailable (would ignore emails, not call back, etc) throughout my time at FSU. I felt unsupported if a problem came up.
- Some classes did not utilize the grading portion of blackboard. Getting little to no feedback during the 43. course was frustrating at times. Weekly feedback regarding discussions and assignments should be mandatory for professors to follow.
- 44. I am an online graduate student. I felt hard to get online library text. It should be polished.

- 45. As a graduate student there was only one class per semester I could take. I already had many of these skills as an undergrad. Some professors did great helping us develop our writing and the research process, others just gave us content.
- It seems that some of the classes are a "rinse and repeat" for the instructors, and so there's limited engagement between students and professors. I'd like to see more instructor involvement with the online 46. students... for example, I'd have appreciated viewing an online lecture from the professors (some did this, and I felt it was helpful in learning the material).
- Excellent On-line library for research for the on-line student. The librarians do a great job and although I do not approve of non-subject matter topics elevated by speakers at events designated for a specific purpose; I 47. have to say they work very hard and provide an excellent product that will be key to increasing the potential for success of your on-line student.
- I feel that in some of the education courses teachers are made to feel guilty and responsible for everything the students do. The main predictor of student achievement is "Socioeconomic background" since students 48 get access to many opportunities. Teacher can try to remediate many issues but they are human. They can not remediate all of the problems of our society. Many of the problems our students face are a reflection of things that have to be improved in Society.
- I had to figure which classes to take at which times on my own. I had asked which classes I could take to 49. continue taking classes without breaks, but kept getting the reply that it didn't matter which order I took them in. I understood that piece, but my point was completely missed and I had to double up one semester.
- Not challenging. Most classes were discussion groups about irrelevant material. About 75% of my MBA was 50. a waste of time. The only professor there that really challenged me was Professor Kim.
- I would have appreciated some type of guidance support rather than the arbitrary calls asking if I'd registered for classes yet. Only because I loved ahead at glad availability was I able to determine that I 51. would not graduate on time without changing the schedule for my last 3 semesters due to the availability of one class












23. To which racial heritage do you predominantly identify?
